59 religious buildings destroyed

Environmental Damage

More than

1200

**cases of environmental
damages fixed**

shelling of industrial enterprises caused explosions,
fires emitting toxic chemicals – ammonia, nitric acid
use of **banned bombs with white phosphorus by russians**
More than one-third of the total territory of protected
areas has been damaged
